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Evaluation Services Menu

Mid-Ohio Psychological Services, Inc. provides various evaluation services for the community. Below is a list and brief description of the various types of evaluation services that MOPS can provide. Please use the list to select which evaluation service you are requesting. If you do not see the kind of evaluation that you are looking for, please contact us and we will attempt to identify a mechanism for meeting your needs. Samples of evaluation documents can be provided upon request. We do not provide custody evaluations for Domestic Relations Court.

Prior to scheduling any evaluation, we will need confirmation of who will be paying for the services. We will provide you with an estimate letter based on the type of evaluation report your agency is requesting and request you sign the estimate agreeing to pay for the service.

The following is a list of the various kinds of evaluations that we typically produce and a description of the specific tools used. Please contact the office for a detailed estimated related to the evaluation service.

Option 1: Diagnostic Assessment

All clients receiving any kind of service at MOPS must participate in a Diagnostic Assessment. A Diagnostic Assessment always includes a complete psychosocial history and a review of the presenting complaint. A Diagnostic Assessment usually includes the administration of general personality testing and academic achievement testing. Diagnostic Assessments do not result in a formal report, but do result in a case note that usually includes a provisional diagnosis and treatment plan. The outcome of a Diagnostic Assessment usually results in participation in treatment.

Option 2: Focal Evaluation

Focal Evaluations are structured evaluations and reports designed to address a specific issue. These evaluations include everything in a standard diagnostic assessment as well as assessment techniques to specially address the referral issue. Focal Evaluations result in the production of a report to the referral source that includes a history of the problem, pertinent psychosocial history, collateral material (treatment records, school records, social summary, medical records, etc.) relevant test/structured interview interpretation, diagnosis, and general

recommendations. Focal evaluations also include clear efforts to link the subject of the evaluation to appropriate resources based on the results of the evaluation. Prior to the Focal Evaluation session, referral sources will need to identify which Focal Evaluation is being requested and provide brief information as to why the evaluation is being sought. Most Focal Evaluations are between three and six pages in length. Focal Evaluations are only provided to adults.

We offer the following Focal Evaluations:

Batterer/Anger Management/Domestic Violence Focal Evaluation **\$1,000**

Includes Family Violence History, Aggression History and possibly additional personality testing with general recommendations provided

Domestic Violence Survivor Focal Evaluation **\$1,000**

Includes Family Violence History, Aggression History and possibly additional personality testing with general recommendations provided

Alcohol and Other Drug Focal Evaluation **\$1,000**

Includes additional assessment measures including: Substance Abuse Subtle Screening Inventory, Sobriety Maintenance Skills Assessment, The Stages of Change Readiness and Treatment Eagerness Scale and general recommendations

IQ Focal Evaluation **\$1,200**

Includes with intelligence testing, possibly adaptive living assessment measures and general recommendations

ADHD Focal Evaluation **\$1,200**

Includes intelligence testing if not completed within the last two years, Conners' Continuous Performance Test and possible objective rating scale. General recommendations will be provided

Option 3: General Psychological Evaluation

Psychological Evaluations are comprehensive assessments of all issues that are likely to affect the referral problem. Psychological Evaluations include all the assessment techniques that are used for Diagnostic Assessment and Focal Evaluations but result in a comprehensive report. Each report includes a complete psychosocial history, mental status examination, synthesis of collateral material (treatment records, school records, social summary, medical records, etc.), test results interpretation (personality, achievement, and additional testing), explanation of the problem, diagnosis, recommendations and address specific referral questions. Referral sources will need to provide specific referral questions to be addressed in the evaluation as well as extensive information describing the issues relating to the referral

questions. Common evaluation referral questions can be found on our website. The completed report is usually 12 to 20 pages or more in length. General Psychological Evaluations are performed on adults and children.
